## What's "On" in August

This is the last month for most of the free outdoor summer music. Enjoy military band concerts on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays at 8 p.m. on the west side of the Capitol. The 8 p.m. Saturday night Fort Dupont concerts go through August 21. Hear "Jazz in the Garden" every Friday in August from 5 to 8 p.m. at the National Gallery of Art Sculpture Garden. The last of the Sunset Serenades at the zoo is on Thursday, August 5, 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.

An annual summer highlight is the 1812 Overture on Tuesday, August 17, 8 p.m., at the open-air Sylvan Theater on the southeast corner of the Washington Monument grounds, performed by the U.S. Army Band "Pershing's Own" and the 3rd U.S. Infantry Regiment (The Old Guard) Presidential Salute Battery.

Some summer bargains include free admission to the Corcoran Gallery of Art on Saturdays in August; two-for-one admission for DC residents to President Lincoln's Cottage, on the grounds of the Army Retirement Home off North Capitol Street; and free admission for kids (18 and younger) to the Newseum through Labor Day.

The Shakespeare Theatre Free-For-All performs "Twelfth Night" at the Sidney Harman Hall every day except Mondays from August 19 to September 5.

## **Free Spring Bulbs**

The Capitol Hill Garden Club will, once again, give free spring-flowering bulbs for planting in public spaces on Capitol Hill. ## **Call to Water Street Trees in Summer Heat**

*Residents Urged to Adopt Street Trees and Receive Free Watering Devices*

In response to the recent heat waves and dry conditions, the District Department of Transportation's Urban Forestry Administration (UFA) is launching an effort to engage as many residents as possible in watering street trees so they survive this hot summer.

It takes less than ten minutes a week to fill the slow-drip watering device provided for free by the city to any individual who adopts street trees through UFA's Canopy Keepers program.

“Summer heat and normal urban pressures create intense stress for street trees,” said John Thomas, Chief Forester for the District of Columbia. “While UFA crews are watering all 3,500 new trees we planted this year, we are calling on District residents and businesses to help water street trees close to their homes and offices. Together, we can ensure that these taxpayer-funded assets provide their full environmental, economic, and social benefits for years to come.”
